




CONCEPT STATEMENT




SPACES THAT HEAL



The Challenge

Healing Spaces are left Behind.

Component	Focus Area	Implication
Emotional Disconnect	Patients experience stress anxiety and discomfort due to cold clinical and poorly designed spaces	poor design contributes to slower recovery emotional strain and caregiver fatigue
Neglect of Interior Design	Healthcare spaces are often planned without input from professional interior designers	This leads to missed opportunities to improve dignity, care delivery, and operational efficiency.
Untapped Facility Potential	Existing hospitals and clinics in cities like Lagos have potential to be healing environments	Neglecting interior design wastes infrastructure investment and limits positive patient outcomes











The Challenge

Most healthcare spaces in Nigeria are designed for functionality, not healing. The absence of professional interior design in these spaces results in emotionally sterile environments that fail to support patient recovery.

Emotional Disconnect

Many treatment environments for children and young adults with Sickle Cell Disorder often fall short in providing warmth, privacy, and emotional support through thoughtful design.


Critical, yet ignored

As Nigeria's foremost center for Sickle Cell care and education, SCFN serves as a national hub—Despite SCFN's medical breakthroughs, its internal environment doesn't reflect the dignity of care it provides. This initiative is the ideal location to pilot a new vision for healing environments across Nigeria.

IDAN Relevance

The interior design profession is often overlooked in planning and retrofitting healthcare facilities, despite its potential to improve care delivery, patient recovery, reduce worker burnout, and enhance public trust. IDAN seeks to showcase how professional interior design can positively influence well-being, dignity, and healthcare outcomes.







Why SCFN?

SCFN serves as a primary outpatient center for Sickle Cell Disease (SCD) patients throughout Nigeria, making significant strides in research and treatment initiatives. The facility holds great visibility and national significance for policy, advocacy, and raising public awareness. Additionally, SCFN is a strategic location for piloting a replicable, design-driven health intervention.








Our Response

IDAN is redesigning the 500 sqm LUTH Sickle Cell Ward to promote psychosocial healing through thoughtful interior design. This includes waiting lounges, consultation rooms, and treatment areas – using color, lighting, and form to support recovery.




